





Lansingburgh Book Club

	<p><u>The Book of Joe</u> by Jonathan Tropper (2005) NOV. Humorous fictional novel. Protagonist returns home a best-selling author and deals with the fall out from his autobiographical debut and the prospect of a “sophomore slump.”</p>
	<p><u>No Matter How Loud I Shout: A Year in the Life of Juvenile Court</u> by Edward Humes (1997) JAN. Powerful non-fiction from Pulitzer prize winning author. Vivid stories about individual cases, allows readers to decide if the juvenile justice system works.</p>
	<p><u>The Attack</u> by Yasmina Khadra (2007) MAR. Now a major motion picture. Fiction. Arab-Israeli surgeon deals with the suicide-bomb attack that kills his wife, searches for answers, some hard to accept.</p>
	<p><u>Quiet: The Power of Introvers in a World That Can't Stop Talking</u> by Susan Cain (2013) MAY Best-selling non-fiction. Explores the phenomenon of introverts, their alienation throughout history, as well as serves to highlight successful introverts.</p>
